

I. 2015 Jockey Club Hong Kong Coaching Awards Presentation Ceremony



A total of 135 coaches were honoured at the 2015 Jockey Club Hong Kong Coaching Awards Presentation Ceremony which was held on Sunday, 17 April 2016 at the Hong Kong Sports Institute (HKSI). Over 190 nominations were received in seven categories of awards. This year, a new category, School Coach Recognition Awards, has been added to pay tribute to full-time teachers who have made special contribution to school sports. The other six award categories are Coach of the Year, Distinguished Services for Coaching, Coach Education, Best Team Sport Coach, Coaching Excellence and Community Coach Recognition Awards.

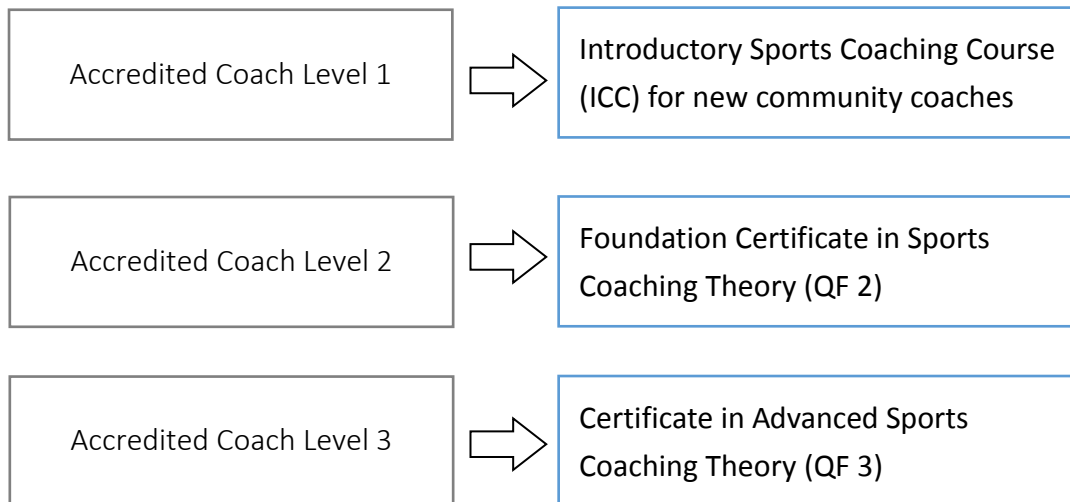

II. Jockey Club Coach Education Programme

II-A: "Accredited Coach Renewal Scheme"

To promote the culture of lifelong professional development in sports coaching industry. Accredited Coaches (AC) Level 1 (ICC), Level 2 (QF2) and Level 3 (QF3) are required to fulfill 24, 36 and 48 continuing coach education hours respectively under the Accredited Coach Renewal Scheme (ACRS). II-B: "Introductory Sports Coaching Course"

To address the need of member NSAs for training new coaches at the community level, the Hong Kong Coaching Committee (HKCC) has recently launched a new "Introductory Sports Coaching Course" (ICC). It covers nine sports theory topics in coaching and sports science with a total of 28 contact hours. Graduates will be granted a certificate of "Introductory Sports Coaching Course" (equivalent to Level 1 Accredited Coach) under the HKCC. With this basic coaching qualification plus the relevant NSAs' sport-specific components, graduates will be able to take up elementary coaching work at beginner's level. II-C: “Foundation Certificate in Sports Coaching Theory”

In order to enhance the quality and the level of recognition of coach education programmes, the HKCC launched the “Foundation Certificate in Sports Coaching Theory” (FSC) course in 2014. The FSC has been accredited by the Hong Kong Council for Accreditation of Academic and Vocational Qualifications (HKCAAVQ) at Qualification Framework (QF) Level 2, and the October/November 2016 intake will be open for enrollment in August 2016. Further announcement will be posted on our HKCC website.

II-D: “Certificate in Advanced Sports Coaching Theory”

A new course, Certificate in Advanced Sports Coaching Theory (ASC) course, which has been accredited by the HKCAAVQ at QF Level 3, had the first intake in March 2016 with 30 students. The ASC course follows a modular approach, which includes 10 modules and a 30-hour coaching practicum. Students will complete the course in September 2016, and graduates of ASC will be able to obtain 25 QF Credits upon graduation.



III. Jockey Club Coaching Directors Forum

The Jockey Club Coaching Directors Forum is an annual gathering which aims to enhance the communication between coaching directors of member NSAs. The latest Coaching Directors Forum was held on 31 March 2016 to update on the 2016 NSA subvention scheme on coach education, with 25 Coaching Directors and representatives from 16 member NSAs attended.



IV. Jockey Club Continuing Coach Education Programme

The 1st 2016/17 Jockey Club Continuing Coach Education Programme (JCCCEP) seminar - “Injury prevention exercise programme and sports taping” was held on 15 June 2016 with over 200 participants.
